What is the difference between AP and Dual Enrollment?

Advanced Placement:

College Board Advanced Placement (AP) courses are college-level classes that a student can take while still in high school. In AP classes, students engage in intense discussions, solve problems collaboratively, and learn to analyze and discover. AP exams are based on nationally recognized curricula and give students an opportunity to earn college credit from most four-year colleges and universities in the U.S. and in more than 60 other countries. Time management skills, self-discipline, and strong study habits are important in ensuring success in AP courses. Students should check college websites to determine AP exam scores required for credit.

Dual Enrollment:

The Georgia Dual Enrollment Program allows eligible students to take college level coursework for credit towards both high school and college. Students must meet the admission requirements of the postsecondary institution through which the coursework is offered. Many courses will transfer to other colleges and universities as a core credit or as an elective credit. Students should investigate the transfer options for both high school and future college credit. There is a 30-hour cap for funding hours that cannot be acceded.

AP Capstone Diploma Program

Habersham Central offers the distinctive AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA Program. Students have an opportunity to earn an AP CAPSTONE Diploma by achieving an AP exam score of 3 or higher in AP Seminar, AP Research, and four additional AP courses. The AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA is a significant distinction that sets students apart in competitive college admissions. The coursework fosters collaborative teamwork, independent research, and communication skills that are increasingly valued by colleges and industry.

Students not already enrolled in an Honors or AP course should talk with their recommending teacher and/or the teacher of the Honors or AP course.

Weighted Grades

Seven points are added to the final grade in AP courses and degree level Dual Enrollment courses. This is a local weighting that affects overall grade point average and class rank but does not apply to the HOPE Scholarship calculation. The Georgia Student Finance Commission determines weighting for HOPE Scholarship eligibility.
